The *Christian Visitor* newspaper (dated 12 June 1862) carried the death of Mary (Winchester) Morgan. The paper was officially called "*The New Brunswick Baptist & Christian Visitor: The Organ of the Eastern and Western NB Baptist Associated Churches.*"

On Wed. the 11<sup>th</sup> inst, **Mary**, the **beloved wife of Mr. Thomas Morgan**,<sup>[1]</sup> in the 37<sup>th</sup> year of her age<sup>[2]</sup> leaving a husband and five children to mourn their loss. Funeral on the 13<sup>th</sup> at two o'clock from her late residence Bridge Road, Portland. Friends are invited to attend.

The amputation came too late, however, as the poison had impregnated his system, and after lingering for a couple of months, death resulted.
